#### **Record of Public Session:**

- a) Reports or comment from any member of the public or any other village organisation (notes only):
  - With reference to HMP & YOI Hollesley Bay the following comments were made by members of the public:
    - o Ex officer, The Governor applied for sex offenders to be at prison, up to 80% of total role, over 300, it's an open prison, they can walk about unsupervised, some don't turn up, staff have to look for prisons, concern about children, serious incident waiting to happen, sudden move is outrageous and dangerous, Councillors should do all they can to stop this,
    - o Reopen the officers club as a visitors centre has been rumoured; lots of children and footpaths, no gates, not monitoring, no CCTV near school, other similar prisons do not have schools or footpaths, everything should be done within our power, there is a time and a place for rehabilitation,
    - o I Work in the prison, offenders will be going to shingle Street, how is this a measured risk to the public,
    - o I call on the Council to propose a number of measure, public meeting addressed by Governor, invite A Reid and Therese Coffey, I spoke to the Chief Constable who is very uncomfortable, we need to demonstrate a unity of view to flush out with a series of actions, been stopped before but it needs a proactive role, this is a threat, we should have rehabilitation but in a more appropriate situation;
    - o There should have been a consultation, Perhaps it is a decision that has been made,
    - Needs to be taken forward ASAP nothing has been received by the prison to say people are unhappy, Governor needs to be aware of the unrest, this decision can be turned round, this will affect all the population, will also affect RSPB visitors, will also affect SPN, due process needs to have been demonstrated and the PC should ask if this has been done
    - o Another recent decision was reversed as it was near a school, an online petition may be needed, (One has been set up)
    - o people will be very vulnerable, public highway in the middle, Oak Hill is very close, there needs to be more training for the officers, timelines are very short, other inmates are not happy, everybody know the reality of how the prison is stretched and this is going to take an awful lot of more policing, rehabilitation will need lots of resource, they will start coming in in the new year
    - o No member of staff will have neem trained yet, three young children, always played outside, if this goes ahead this will stop

c) DC/18/2784/FUL - Retention and completion of cartlodge with ancillary accommodation over The Drey, Rectory Road Hollesley	<ul> <li>c) Councillors made the following comments:</li> <li>More contentious, along the boundary of one of the proposed new properties, cart lodge goes long the length of the rear garden</li> <li>Trees detail is not on the plans</li> <li>Two stories looking over the back garden of a house yet to be built</li> <li>It will be there when people buy the other house, quality is very high, substantial cart lodge, you can see it from Rectory Road but hidden by trees at the moment</li> <li>This is impacting on the environment of people living there,</li> <li>This is a separate plot, one house already there and the cart lodge looks like it is for this house</li> <li>This is retrospective application but that is not mentioned</li> <li>It is a planning condition if it has been built without planning permission for a reason</li> <li>Conclusion – object due to it being a retrospective application where planning permission requirements would have been known to the applicant, it impacts on the neighbouring plot and trees and the size is disproportionate to the size of current plot, proposed by Cllr. a)	Expenditure on Scoping Phase of Teen Hub element of Project (£6,000 in total)	a) The Clerk reiterated the section of her written report regarding the expenses.  These were agreed as acceptable by Councillors and it was confirmed that no further expenses would be agreed until the next section of the project could be discussed and agreed by Councillors. Duck Corner to Water Tower Path - To discuss e-mail from SCC Highways and site meeting:	A site meeting had taken place earlier that evening at which Mr David Chenery had kindly explained 4 different options: <ul> <li>Full path on the edge of the road with kerbs and drains (circa £100k)</li> <li>Path behind a hedge with suitable entrances(circa £30k)</li> <li>Reduction in speed limit to 40 mph (circa £10k)</li> <li>New signage (circa £2k)</li> </ul> It was agreed that each option must be fully explored and that first the two land owners (SPT and Greenwells) should be approached to ask if they would be prepared to sell/lease/donate their land. If this was not a possibility this would rule out options 1 and 2 and the other options would then be explored. <li>The Clerk was also asked to obtain figures for the signs from a private company.</li>	Clerk to write to SPT and Greenwells.
