To discuss and agree responses to the following Planning Applications: a) DC/20/4334/FUL - Change of use of existing agricultural building to B8 storage use Former Diary Unit, Grove Farm, Grove Road, Hollesley a) The Councillors made the following comments: • Two comments from local residents have been circulated • Planning policy has been investigated but there seems to be no specific policy on this subject; only on use of agricultural buildings; apart from S.4.6 which talks about traffic • If the building had been slightly smaller it would not have needed planning permission and could have been converted under 'Permitted Development' rights. • The site is well away from any houses so shouldn't disturb residents • This is no longer a working farm so one of the policies in the application is perhaps not valid • I have concerns for the other users of this road, such as walkers and horse riders; however, this may slow vehicles down • This is quite a busy road and is used by some to 'cut through' to Boyton • I think it is better for this building to be used for something rather than becoming derelict. • I have concerns for any chemicals that may leak from the boats/caravans, is the drainage sufficient?
